	 Parents gave the feedback that often these are not well known programs and that it would be helpful to send parents info as well as giving the info to students so that we can coach and guide our kids Co-op Sign up and talk about what areas you are interested in and find a co-op placement in that area of interest Can do this over the summer if desired, and can be paid Teachers will assist with placements 	
4.0 Principal's Report	 Students heading for trades: New Program Students going into grade 11 have the opportunity to go directly into trades after grade 10, with a new model and learning path Anyone who knows they are going into trades, can go into focus apprenticeships With this opportunity over the next 2 years there are credits that are mandatory (Gr 11 Math, Gr 11/12 English taken in grade 11), with a co-op each semester in an apprenticeship placement (that can be paid) and all of grade 12 is co-op apprenticeship Building as we go, to get apprenticeships Parent feedback: these new programs should be highlighted in an email so that we are aware and can discuss with the kids The grade 10s have had lots of information on this, through co-op and guidance 	



Credit Recovery

- 9 day program in the beginning of July being hosted at Dunbarton to recover credits that were missed in grade 9/10
- It is possible to recover more than 1 credit
- Recovery dependent on how hard they want to work
- No minimum mark required to qualify for credit recovery

Course selection

- Process is now complete
